In the past year, the Research Committee on "Scriptural Reasoning and Comparative Literature" has been promoting and fostering the spirit of Scriptural Reasoning by sponsoring the following academic events:

1. International Conferences:

- International workshops for young scholars in ancient textual comparative studies: This workshop runs biannually since June 17-24, 2017, and each time four distinguished scholars will be invited to give lectures on ancient classical studies and ancient civilizations, and 40 junior faculty members and PhD students will be invited to participate with their own research proposals. So far SR Research Committee has helped run three workshops with different themes: "Canonical Texts and Commentaries," "Manuscripts and Materiality of Text," (Jan. 5-13, 2018) and "Ancient Historiography in Comparison" (June 13-18, 2018). This is another way to practice and live out the spirit of Scriptual Reasoning because each one is forced to compare their own research with similar research interest from other civilizations. The spirit of being open-minded and inclusive is encouraged in such workshops.
- Annual "Confucius China Studies Program" PhD Forum: On June 7-8, 2018 the third annual CCSP PhD Forum will be on, and 16 students will present their papers in 1.5 days. CCSP is a scholarship sponsoring international PhD students in the area of humanities and social sciences, whose research topics are related to China. This scholarship supports students to study in China as an exchange students or full-time student. The Forum provides a platform for these students to exchange and learn from each other while they are in China. Because their research topics are varied and crossing many disciplines, the Forum has become a good channel for students from all parts of the world.

The purpose of the project is to find the good translators of different languages and present some good-quality research materials for Chinese scholars so that the Chinese scholars in the area of humanities may find some inspirations after reading the "scriptural reasoning" activities in these foreigners' writings about China.
